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## SENATE RESOLUTION

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REQUESTING DEPARTMENTS AND OTHER AGENCIES OF THE STATE AND THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO DESIGNATE GOVERNMENT PARKING LOTS FOR USE AT NIGHT BY THE HOMELESS WHO OWN VEHICLES AND SLEEP IN THEIR VEHICLES.

1           WHEREAS, as a result of the depressed economy, in the last  
2 few years the State of Hawaii and the City and County of  
3 Honolulu have experienced increasing numbers of homeless persons  
4 in Hawaii; and

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6           WHEREAS, while homelessness is an issue that cuts across  
7 cultural lines, the primary common denominator in the plight of  
8 the homeless is the lack of affordable housing; and

9  
10          WHEREAS, there are many circumstances that drive people out  
11 of their homes, such as substance abuse, serious health  
12 problems, mental health conditions, war veterans, foster youths  
13 who have aged out of the system but are not yet ready to be on  
14 their own, in-migration from the mainland, and for many the  
15 inability to earn enough money to pay rent; and

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17          WHEREAS, according to the Homeless Service Utilization  
18 Report prepared by the Center on the Family at the University of  
19 Hawaii and the Homeless Programs Office of the Department of  
20 Human Services, for 2010 there were 11,101 homeless persons on  
21 Oahu and 15,604 statewide; and

22  
23          WHEREAS, the actual number of homeless persons is higher  
24 than these unofficial counts, as providers of homeless services  
25 who do not receive state funding are not required to report the  
26 numbers of their clients; and

27  
28          WHEREAS, children and youth comprise thirty-five percent of  
29 the homeless population who live in shelters and ten percent of  
30 those who do not live in shelters; and

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32          WHEREAS, among those who live in shelters, forty-three  
33 percent have children, and of these, seventy-six percent are  
34 families led by their mothers; and among those who do not live



1 in shelters, twenty-one percent have children, and of these,  
2 sixty-two percent are families led by their mothers; and  
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4 WHEREAS, thirty-five percent of those who live in shelters  
5 and forty-two percent of those who live on the streets have been  
6 homeless between one and eleven months; and  
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8 WHEREAS, many homeless persons sleep in their cars wherever  
9 they can find a safe place to park their car; and  
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



11 WHEREAS, state and municipal parking lots are largely empty  
12 during night hours, the time when the homeless need a place to  
13 sleep; now, therefore,  
14

15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth  
16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011,  
17 that departments and other agencies of the State and the City  
18 and County of Honolulu are requested to designate government  
19 parking lots for use by homeless persons who own their own  
20 vehicles and sleep in the vehicles, between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.;

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the parking lots of the  
24 Department of Education parking structure at the corner of  
25 Vineyard Boulevard and Punchbowl Street, and at the Aloha  
26 Stadium be designated for use between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. by  
27 homeless persons who own their own vehicles; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that toilet facilities and security  
30 be provided by the State and the City and County of Honolulu, or  
31 other stakeholders, at designated sites between 10 p.m. and  
32 6 a.m.; and  
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34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
35 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Mayor of the City  
36 and County of Honolulu, and each department head of the State  
37 and the City and County of Honolulu.
