<u>SB 1273, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1169)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. Authorizes the Insurance Commissioner to enforce consumer protections and market reforms relating to insurance of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. (SD1)	HLT, CPC
<u>SB 1484, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1087)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Exempts from insurance code, associations organized before 1880 with only members who are active, retired, or honorably discharged members of the United States armed forces and whose principal purpose is to provide specified benefits to members. (SB1484 HD1)	PBM, CPC
<u>SB 27, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR467)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE. Removes long-term care insurance from the definition of "accident and health or sickness insurance" and related terms within the insurance code; removes reference to insurance fraud statute. (SD1)	CPC
<u>SB 1559, SD2, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1134)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS. Establishes incentives for important agricultural lands. Effective July 1, 2020. (SB1559 HD1)	AGR/WLO, CPC

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
