| <u>HB 712</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO HAWAIIAN EDUCATION. Requires the Department of Education to establish a complete Hawaiian education program, incorporating Hawaiian language and cultural curricula. | EDN/HAW, FIN |
| <u>HB 703</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO SCHOOL REGISTRATION FEES. Requires an annual \$25 registration fee for each public school or public charter school student. Establishes registration fee special funds. Empowers the teachers to decide how to expend registration fee funds to benefit the students. Applies to school year 2012-2013. | EDN, FIN |
| <u>HB 657</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE DRIVER EDUCATION. Uses a portion of the liquor tax revenues to implement programs to prevent drunk driving by persons under the age of 21 as part of existing state driver education and training programs. | EDN, CPC, FIN |

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HB 941 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN
Status Allows home school students to participate in any extracurricular activities offered by a public school. Requires home school students to pay applicable activity-participation fees.

HB 875 RELATING TO STUDENT ENROLLMENT. EDN, JUD
Status Establishes requirements for powers of attorney executed for student enrollment purposes. Expressly prohibits uses of powers of attorney to circumvent school enrollment requirements, and requires parents and guardians to certify that a power of attorney is not being used for those purposes.

HB 1562 RELATING TO SPECIAL EDUCATION. EDN, FIN
Status Changes terminology from "exceptional child" to "student with a disability" and clarifies criteria for designation; clarifies definition of services auxiliary to education required to be provided to students with a disability; clarifies eligibility standards for preschool students with a disability; clarifies charter school duties toward children with a disability; establishes certification criteria for persons who provide interpreting services for children who are deaf or hard of hearing and certain students with a disability.

~~Status~~ Establishes implementing legislation for the appointment of board of education members. Establishes considerations for the senate during the advise and consent process.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW


