SB 298, SD3 (SSCR794) Status	RELATING TO BUSINESS REGULATION. Establishes an organizational and regulatory framework for sustainable benefits corporations. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD3)	ERB, CPC, FIN
SB 590, SD1 (SSCR640) Status	RELATING TO THE LEGISLATIVE FEDERAL ECONOMIC STIMULUS PROGRAM OVERSIGHT COMMISSION. Extends the date on which the legislative federal economic stimulus program oversight commission is terminated from 06/30/11 to 12/31/11. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	ERB, LMG, FIN
SB 775, SD2 (SSCR732) Status	RELATING TO CONSTRUCTION SITES. Reauthorizes the construction site inspection task force and narrows its focus to unlicensed contractor activity. Establishes a fee and surcharge to offset the costs of task force activities to be added to license application and renewal fees. Requires report. Appropriates funds from the compliance resolution fund. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)	ERB, CPC, FIN
SB 776, SD2 (SSCR654) Status	RELATING TO SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY. Establishes a task force to identify barriers that Hawaii businesses and university professors face in developing entrepreneurial business models in biotechnology, and to recommend specific actions to address these barriers; requires report to the 2012 legislature; appropriates funds. Effective 07/01/50. (SD2)	ERB, HED, FIN

RELATING TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS. SB 1161, SD1 ERB, CPC, FIN (SSCR553) Exempts broadband infrastructure improvements from state or county Status permitting requirements for five years. Exempts telecommunications companies from replacing existing utility poles when installing new or improving existing telecommunications cables. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1) RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY REVIEW ERB, CPC, FIN SB 1498, SD2 (SSCR528) BOARD. Status Transfers the small business regulatory review board from the department of business, economic development, and tourism to the department of commerce and consumer affairs, and authorizes the expenses of the board to be funded from the compliance resolution fund; requires each agency to notify the board on an annual basis of any rules to be amended or repealed to reflect statutory amendment or repeal. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) SB 1522, SD2 RELATING TO DOGS. ERB, CPC/JUD, (SSCR772) Establishes requirements for licensure and regulation of large-scale **FIN** dog breeders. Effective 7/1/2012. (SD2) **Status** SB 112, SD1 RELATING TO TOURISM. ERB, FIN (SSCR712) Appropriates funds in FY 2011-2012 and FY 2012-2013 for the Status application of a spaceport license from the Federal Aviation Administration to establish space tourism in Hawaii. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD1) SB 165, SD2 RELATING TO AEROSPACE DEVELOPMENT. ERB. FIN (SSCR676) Extends the sunset date of the starlight reserve advisory committee by Status two years; makes appropriations to the office of aerospace development of the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY. SB 753, SD2 ERB, FIN (SSCR753) Adds reporting requirements to measure the effectiveness of the tax Status credit for research activities. Extends the tax credit for 5 years. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2) SB 757, SD2 RELATING TO SMALL BUSINESS. ERB, FIN (SSCR639) Reestablishes the Hawaii capital loan revolving fund; requires that **Status** principal and interest payments being made on outstanding loans be deposited into the fund; authorizes the department of business, economic development, and tourism to contract with financial institutions for servicing or administering loans; appropriates funds for the operations of the Hawaii capital loan program. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) SB 758, SD1 RELATING TO SMALL BUSINESS. ERB. FIN (SSCR493) Extends the use of Hawaii compliance express for small business

vendors for awards of \$2,500 or greater. (SD1)
