HB 404
Status

RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE
REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST PALOLO CHINESE HOME AND
ITS SUBSIDIARIES.

FIN

Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Palolo Chinese Home in financing the capital costs related to the expansion, construction, and rebuilding of its facilities.

Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC FINANCE.

FIN

Sets forth the State's allocation of any annual or other limit on the principal amount of bonds that may be issued by issuers within Hawaii, including tax exempt interest, tax credits, interest subsidies or other benefits under the Internal Revenue Code, which is limited by federal law.

Status

RELATING TO STATE MONEYS.

FIN

Enhances the State's authority to invest in state bonds.

HB 1252
Status

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT FACILITIES.

FIN

Changes the formula for assessments on construction projects managed by the department of accounting and general services to carry out the program of centralized engineering services, including repair and maintenance on government facilities.



<u>HB 564</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE EMERGENCY AND BUDGET RESERVE FUND. Increases from 5% to 10% the percentage of moneys from the excess general fund balance to be deposited into the emergency and budget reserve fund as a temporary source of funding for the State during times of emergency, severe economic downturn, and unforeseen reduction in revenues.	FIN
<u>HB 744</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DAM SAFETY. Establishes a dam safety task force to recommend safety actions to be included in the Hawaii dam safety program. Sunsets 6/30/12.	FIN
<u>HB 1267</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. Makes appropriations to the DHS and the Hawaii health systems corporation for the costs associated with Medicaid programs and comprehensive health care services, respectively.	FIN
<u>HB 774</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATE FUNDS. Requires temporarily the deposit of surcharge revenues to the emergency medical services special fund from the neurotrauma special fund. Requires the transfer of unexpended and unencumbered moneys in the repealed health care revolving fund to be transferred to the emergency medical services special fund.	FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW


