<u>HB 605, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR411)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Establishes the Reduced Ignition Propensity Cigarette Program Special Fund to be funded by fees collected from cigarette manufacturers to administer and provide staff for the Reduced Ignition Propensity Cigarette Program. Authorizes the State Fire Council to employ administrative staff. Effective July 1, 2011.	PBM, FIN
