<u>HB 4, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR263)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE INTERSTATE COMPACT ON EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY FOR MILITARY CHILDREN. Makes permanent the interstate compact on educational opportunity for military children. Deletes the definition of "test period". Deletes provisions relating to the furnishing of unofficial education records and principal's determination of available space. Clarifies military representation on state council on educational opportunity for military children within BOE. Effective June 30, 2011.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 1058</u> <u>(HSCR23)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAPITAL INVESTMENTS. Amends chapter 37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to include agency-wide technology and computer systems with an estimated useful life of greater than seven years as capital investments to allow all costs to be financed with bond funds and depreciated as capital investments.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 1054</u> <u>(HSCR21)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Amends Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to require the Committee on Weights to meet not less than once every odd-numbered year	EDN, FIN
<u>HB 338, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR85)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Sets the terms and conditions of a student voting member on an appointed Board of Education.	EDN, FIN

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDN/LAB, FIN

Makes permanent statutory provisions that: (1) reduced the maximum employment period for teachers hired on an emergency basis by DOE from 4 years to 3 years; and (2) require those unlicensed teachers hired on an emergency basis prior to 7/1/08, to attain licensure within 4 years from the date of employment.

RELATING TO THE CERTIFICATION OF PRINCIPALS AND VICE-PRINCIPALS.

EDN/LAB, FIN

Amends section 302A-605, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to replace language regarding principal and vice-principal candidate qualifications that conflicts with the requirements of the Race to the Top grant.

RELATING TO RECONSTITUTING SCHOOLS.

EDN, FIN

Allows the superintendent of education to reconstitute a public school, except for certain charter schools. Allows the superintendent to recommend actions to charter school review panel, including the revocation of a school's charter.


