<u>HB 889, HD2</u> (HSCR574) Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes health care-associated infection reporting requirements. Effective January 7, 2009.	HLT, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 863</u> (HSCR488) Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Amends the date when the Hawaii Health Authority is required to submit its findings and recommendations to the Legislature.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1330, HD1</u> (HSCR465) Status	RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOBACCO SETTLEMENT SPECIAL FUND. Extends the appropriation of a portion of Hawaii Tobacco Settlement Special Fund moneys for annual operating expenses of the John A. Burns School of Medicine until June 30, 2015, and adds annual reporting requirements. Effective July 1, 2010.	HLT, HED, FIN
<u>HB 756, HD2</u> (HSCR524) Status	RELATING TO BUILDING DESIGN FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Allows the Disability and Communication Access Board to charge fees to defray expenses of reviewing construction plans to ensure compliance with law. Establishes an Accessible Building Design Special Account for plan review fees and cost of compliance with ADA design requirements. Effective January 1, 2012.	HLT, WLO, FIN
<u>HB 761</u> (HSCR290) Status	RELATING TO INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES. Changes references to "mental retardation" or like terms in the Hawaii Revised Statutes to "intellectual disability" or like terms.	HLT, FIN



<u>HB 1384, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR535)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS. Requires a working group to discuss potential improvements to the current prior authorization process for prescription medications. Effective July 1, 2050.	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 326, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR340)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Provides for telehealth services coverage for Medicaid and QUEST patients using Kona Hospital's medical van program.	HLT/HUS, FIN
<u>HB 1045</u> <u>(HSCR340)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Updates the Insurance Code and related provisions to adopt the revisions to the National Association of Insurance Commissioners model laws and regulations for risk-based capital trend test for property and casualty insurers which is required for National Association of Insurance Commissioners accreditation.	HLT, CPC, FIN


