Establishes the Hawaii Medical Doctor Loan Program for University of Hawaii medical school graduates and medical school graduates with training from Hawaii based medical programs working in rural areas of the State. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB902 HD1)	HLT, HED, FIN
<u>HB 1330, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR186)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOBACCO SETTLEMENT SPECIAL FUND. Extends the appropriation of a portion of Hawaii Tobacco Settlement Special Fund moneys for annual operating expenses of the John A. Burns School of Medicine until June 30, 2015, and adds annual reporting requirements. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB1330 HD1)	HLT, HED, FIN

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

Allows for the election of up to two vice-chairpersons of the University of Hawaii board of regents and requires the board to elect any vice-chairperson and chairperson at a meeting held before July 1. Amends the start date of the term of a board chairperson and vice-chairperson.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
