<u>SB 797, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR716)</u> <u>Status</u>	<b>MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.</b> Appropriates funds to the department of health to participate in federal matching grant programs associated with the development of health information technologies. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 893, SD3</u> <u>(SSCR599)</u> <u>Status</u>	<b>RELATING TO INFORMATION ACCESS.</b> Directs the disability and communications access board to contract for a telephone-based service to provide access to timely print media. Makes appropriation. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD3)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 1300, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR625)</u> <u>Status</u>	<b>RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION.</b> Amends corporation board composition to add an at-large member appointed by the Governor, give voting rights to the ex-officio Director of Health member, and adding community members from the respective regional system boards. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HLT, FIN
<u>SB 1538, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR537)</u> <u>Status</u>	<b>RELATING TO HEALTH.</b> Directs the department of health and state civil defense to report to the legislature on progress in implementing the recommendations of the statewide dialysis emergency plan. Appropriates funds to upgrade dialysis facilities and implement the plan. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	<b>Pending Re-referral</b> HLT, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.



**If during the course of the hearing it appears that there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three minutes. This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.**
