Changes references to "mental retardation" or like terms in the Hawaii Revised Statutes to "intellectual disability" or like terms. Effective July 1, 2030; provided that the amendment made to section 321-11.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by this Act shall not be repealed when that section is reenacted on June 30, 2014, by section 8 of Act 21, Special Session Laws of Hawaii, 2009. <u>HB 326, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR795)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Provides for telehealth services coverage for Medicaid and QUEST patients using Kona Hospital's medical van program. (HB326 HD1)	HMS, WAM

When faxing, please indicate to which committee the testimony is being submitted and the date and time of the hearing.
