<u>HB 1250</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to identify public and private properties suitable for multi-unit development. Report to legislature and governor. Makes unspecified appropriations out of rental housing trust fund and dwelling unit revolving fund.	HSG/WLO, FIN
<u>HB 372</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ECONOMIC RECOVERY. Granting temporary relief from county housing requirements as recommended by the construction industry task force to stimulate housing construction statewide.	HSG/WLO, ERB
<u>HB 1253</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HOMELESS. Requires the department of human services to identify suitable properties for a housing first program that identifies affordable rental housing projects, including an initial housing first single resident occupancy affordable rental housing model project site in an urban core. Requires DHS to report to the legislature and the governor.	HSG/WLO, FIN
<u>HB 1117</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOME OCCUPATIONS. Regulates home occupations.	HSG/WLO, ERB



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
