RELATING TO MEAL BREAKS FOR EMPLOYEES. **SB 1405** JDL, WAM

Prohibits an employer who employs fifty or more employees from **Testimony** requiring its employees to work more than five continuous hours **Status** without a scheduled rest or meal period, unless a collective bargaining

> agreement otherwise contains provisions for employee meal breaks. Exempts employers who are the operators of a continuously operating facility that is regulated by an environmental permit, if an on-duty

meal period is provided. Takes effect 7/1/2012.

SB 1076 RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES. JDL

Makes it an unlawful practice for any employer or labor organization **Testimony** to bar or discharge from employment, withhold pay from, or demote an employee solely because the employee uses accrued and available sick Status

leave.

SB 1037 RELATING TO MINIMUM HOURLY WAGE. JDL, WAM

Increases the minimum hourly wage to \$8.50 per hour beginning July **Testimony** 1, 2011 and ending December 31, 2012. Adjusts the minimum hourly

wage thereafter in accordance with consumer price index. **Status**

SB 1040 RELATING TO THE HAWAII OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND JDL, WAM

HEALTH LAW.

Testimony Raises the civil penalty amounts and additional criminal fines for Status violations of the Hawaii occupational safety and health law.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
