<u>HB 1038, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR915)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Makes various revisions to the employees' retirement system. Effective July 1, 2011. (HB1038 HD2)	JDL, WAM
<u>HB 1138</u> <u>Proposed SD1</u> <u>(HSCR686)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ATTORNEY'S LIENS. PROPOSED SD1: Authorizes a lien on an attorney's firm for unpaid certified shorthand reporter services requested by the attorney. Provides that attorney's liens shall attach to judgments, decrees, orders, settlements, and awards pursuant to a court order or arbitration proceeding. <u>HB 1009, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR918)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	<u>RELATING TO FINGERPRINT RETENTION BY HAWAII CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER.</u> <u>Allows the State to retain fingerprints of employment and licensing applicants for whom criminal history record checks are authorized statutorily so that the State can implement a statewide "Rapback" program. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1009 HD2)</u>	<u>JDL, WAM</u> <u>[Measure added on 03-21-10]</u>

When faxing, please indicate to which committee the testimony is being submitted and the date and time of the hearing.

Please note: If you submit your written testimony after 10:00 a.m. the day prior to the hearing, please sign-in at the staff table to testify orally. A copy of your testimony may not be available during the hearing but will be posted online for the public after the hearing.
