HB300 HD2 (HSCR953) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Appropriates funds for the judiciary for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending on June 30, 2013. Effective July 1, 2011. (HB300 HD2)	JDL, WAM
HB169 HD2 (HSCR776) Testimony Status	RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY. Enacts the optional total unemployment rate trigger. Appropriates an unspecified amount for an automated extended benefit claims system. Effective January 1, 2030. (HB169 HD2)	JDL, WAM
HB382 HD2 (HSCR790) Testimony Status	RELATING TO THE AUDITOR. Grants explicit authority to the Auditor to inspect the documents and financial affairs of the Department of Taxation. Requires the Auditor to implement internal policies to protect confidentiality of private personal information contained in tax returns. Provides penalty provisions applicable to the Auditor or Auditor's agent for disclosure of tax information. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB382 HD2)	JDL, WAM
HB575 HD1 (HSCR676) Testimony Status	RELATING TO SALARIES. Extends the five per cent legislative salary decrease from June 30, 2011, to June 30, 2013. Applies the five per cent salary reduction to executive and judicial branch positions. Effective June 29, 2011. (HB575 HD1)	JDL, WAM



HB1041 HD2 (HSCR913) Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND</p> <p>Eliminates medicare part B reimbursements for employeebeneficiaries and spouses of employeebeneficiaries hired after June 30, 2011. Effective July 1, 2011. (HB1041 HD2)</p>	<p>JDL, WAM</p>
HB1076 HD1 (HSCR783) Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW.</p> <p>Earmarks 2009 special administrative transfer for payment of Unemployment Insurance administration expenses. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1076 HD1)</p>	<p>JDL, WAM</p>
HB1085 HD2 (HSCR805) Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.</p> <p>This measure amends Chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to bring the Hawaii statutes on controlled substances to be consistent with the federal laws on controlled substances, and increases the fee for the registration certificate for qualifying patients for medical marijuana. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB1085 HD2)</p>	<p>JDL, WAM</p>
HB1092 HD1 (HSCR681) Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO TAXATION.</p> <p>Provides for the taxation of the pension income of: (1) An individual filer with federal adjusted gross income of \$100,000 or more; (2) A joint or surviving spouse filer with federal adjusted gross income of \$200,000 or more; and (3) a head of household with federal adjusted gross income of \$150,000 or more. Makes the deduction for state taxes paid, inoperative for the same taxpayers. Effective upon its approval and applicable to taxpayer years beginning after December 31, 2010. HB1012 HD1 (HSCR792) Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.</p> <p>Appropriates funds to the Department of the Attorney General for operating expenses of state law enforcement agencies relating to the planning and operation of security services and activities for the 2011 Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Leaders Meeting in Honolulu, Hawaii. Effective July 1, 2022. (HB1012 HD1)</p>	<p>JDL, WAM</p>
HB678 HD3 (HSCR871) Testimony Status	<p><u>RELATING TO INFORMATION.</u></p> <p><u>Requires any government agency responsible for a security breach to pay for the costs of providing each person whose personal information was disclosed with, at a minimum, a three-year subscription to a nationwide consumer reporting agency's services. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB678 HD3)</u></p>	<p><u>EDT/CPN/JDL, WAM</u></p> <p>[Measure added on 3/21/2011]</p>
