<u>HB 1084</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SPECIAL FUND. Establishes a special fund in the lieutenant governor's office and provides that all revenue from name changes, apostille and certification fees, and copy fees be deposited into the fund	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1001</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES. Makes appropriations for claims against the State, its officers, and its employees.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1608</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF INFORMATION PRACTICES. Establishes a Board of Information Practices within the Office of Information Practices.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 251</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MANDATORY ETHICS TRAINING. Adds certain administrative directors, department heads, and other high-level state positions to the enumerated list of people required to complete mandatory ethics training.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1333</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SMALL CLAIMS COURT. Increases the monetary limit of claims that may be filed in small claims court.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 298</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COURT INTERPRETERS. Exempts court interpreters from parking violations for expired meters.	JUD

Status

RELATING TO COURTS OF APPEAL.

JUD

Shortens the time period for filing an application for writ of certiorari with the supreme court from 90 to 30 days, but permits an extension upon written request of up to 30 additional days.

HB 914
Status

RELATING TO POWER OF ATTORNEY.

JUD

Requires a designated attorney-in-fact who is a child of the principal to give notice of the designation and any subsequent acts to any child of the principal who is not designated as attorney-in-fact.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
