<u>HB 261</u> <u>(HSCR454)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES. Provides rulemaking authority to semi-autonomous county public transit agencies, thus allowing them to function as semi-autonomous agencies in their respective counties.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 979</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES. Provides for the automatic repeal of administrative rules effective one hundred eighty days after the repeal of the related statute or ordinance.	JUD
<u>HB 439</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EVIDENCE. Extends evidentiary presumptions regarding publications and legal opinions to those posted to government websites.	JUD
<u>HB 1141, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR232)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIFORM INFORMATION PRACTICES ACT. Clarifies circumstances under which complaints submitted to agencies shall be made available to the public. Effective date July 1, 2050. (HB1141 HD1)	CPC, JUD
<u>HB 681</u> <u>(HSCR366)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE MILITARY. Allows reservists and national guard members in active service who desire to run for office to file nomination papers and take their oaths by mail.	PBM, JUD



<u>HB 49</u> <u>(HSCR365)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ARMED FORCES SERVICE MEMBERS. Recognizes the federally prescribed DD Form 93, or its successor form, as an acceptable method of determining the person authorized to direct disposition of an armed forces service member's remains.	PBM, JUD
<u>HB 1107</u> <u>(HSCR364)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII NATIONAL GUARD. Authorizes members of the Hawaii national guard to use non-lethal weapons, including electric guns, when assisting civil authorities in disaster relief, civil defense, or law enforcement functions.	PBM, JUD
<u>HB 551, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR280)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS. Permits county liquor authority investigators to possess electric guns. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB551 HD1)	PBM, JUD

<u>HB 381</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATUTORY REVISION: AMENDING VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES FOR THE PURPOSE OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES, CLARIFYING LANGUAGE, AND DELETING UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS. Amends various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes for the purpose of correcting errors and references, clarifying language, and deleting unnecessary provisions.	JUD


