| <u>SB 44, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR482)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Requires the department of public safety to establish performance indicators for inmate reentry system. Requires reports, using key performance indicators, to be provided to the legislature. Creates the corrections and program report as a consolidated report of certain other annual reports. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | PBM, FIN |
| <u>SB 1067, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR503)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO PROBATION. Clarifies the permissible divulging of adult probation records by probation officers to treatment service providers. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | PBM, JUD |
| <u>SB 49, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR484)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES. Requires the department of public safety to report to the legislature any inmate or correctional facility employee death within 48 hours. (SD1) | PBM, LMG |
| <u>SB 48, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR483)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO CORRECTIONS. Specifies criteria that must be considered in deciding whether to transfer inmates between correctional facilities located in Hawaii and to transfer inmates from Hawaii to mainland facilities. Prohibits transfer of inmates to mainland with 12 months or less to serve before being eligible to be paroled. (SD1) | PBM, FIN |
| <u>SB 1357, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR736)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Directs DPS to develop a master plan for the return of Hawaii inmates housed in mainland prisons. Report to 2012 legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | PBM, FIN |



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| <u>SB 1358, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR643)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Requires the department of public safety to develop a plan to reopen the Kulani correctional facility, implement transfers, and house newly sentenced individuals by 12/31/2011. Report to 2012 legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | PBM, FIN |
| <u>SB 171, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR574)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Bans the ignition, possession, selling, and use of aerial luminaries. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | PBM, JUD |
| <u>SB 172, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR575)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Amends provisions of the fireworks code, imposing new definitions and permitting, importation, labeling, and inspection requirements. Authorizes the fire chief to revoke or suspend permits for enumerated reasons. (SD2) | PBM, JUD |
| <u>SB 173, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR580)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION. Prohibits the retail sale or distribution of novelty lighters within the State. (SD2) | PBM, JUD |
| <u>SB 782, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR581)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO DANGEROUS WEAPONS. Prohibits any person from possessing, constructing, setting off, igniting, discharging, or otherwise causing to explode any homemade explosive device. Establishes a violation of this prohibition as a class C felony. (SD2) | PBM, JUD |
| <u>SB 640, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR645)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE WIRELESS ENHANCED 911 FUND. Requires the independent audit of the wireless enhanced 911 fund to be conducted annually rather than biannually. Requires that information on the status of projects undertaken or planned by public safety answering points, and the results of the annual audit, to be included in the wireless enhanced 911 board's annual report to the legislature. Requires the initial annual audit to be conducted in 2011 and its results to be reported to the legislature in 2012. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | PBM, FIN |
| <u>SB 11, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR685)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE SHERIFF. Creates a task force to plan for the establishment of a department of the sheriff to assume responsibilities and functions exercised by the sheriff division of the department of public safety. Report to the legislature. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2) | PBM, FIN |
| <u>SB 1025, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR475)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE. Expands the offenses of assault against a law enforcement officer in the first and second degree to include assaults against firefighters and water safety officers. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1) | PBM, JUD |
| <u>SB 883, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR604)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO SPECIAL NUMBER PLATES. Designates a new special design Gold Star Family plate for children, parents, grandparents, spouses, and siblings of fallen soldiers and to be provided no later than 10/01/2011. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2) | PBM, FIN |

RELATING TO INSURANCE.
Exempts from insurance code, associations organized before 1880 with only members who are active, retired, or honorably discharged members of the U.S. armed forces and whose principal purpose is to provide specified benefits to members. (SD1)


