<u>HB 1109, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR771)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE. Allows an employee with a family member in the United States armed forces who is on active duty or notified of a call to active duty, to use family leave for certain activities for which an employee may take military family leave under federal law. Requires the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations in consultation with the Department of Defense to adopt administrative rules to implement those provisions. Effective July 1, 2030. <u>HB 681, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR807)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE MILITARY. Allows reservists and National Guard members in active service who desire to run for office to file nomination papers and take their oaths by mail. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB681 HD1)	PGM, JDL
<u>HB 49, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR808)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ARMED FORCES SERVICE MEMBERS. Recognizes the federally prescribed DD Form 93, or its successor form, as an acceptable method of determining the person authorized to direct disposition of an armed forces service member's remains. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB49 HD1)	PGM, JDL



<p><u>HB 1107, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR809)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE HAWAII NATIONAL GUARD. Authorizes qualified members of the Hawaii national guard to use non-lethal weapons, including electric guns, when assisting civil authorities in disaster relief, civil defense, or law enforcement functions. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB1107 HD1)</p>	<p>PGM, JDL</p>
<p><u>HB 314, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR804)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS. Establishes the Office of Disaster Preparedness and a Disaster Preparedness Commission to develop a disaster preparedness plan. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB314 HD1)</p>	<p>PGM, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 318, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR803)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO VOG. Establishes a County of Hawaii Interagency Task Force on Vog to discuss the impact of vog on the people of Hawaii and find ways to address these issues. Effective July 1, 2050. <p><u>HB 492, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR766)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Addresses the operational deficiencies of the sheriff division of the department of public safety that were highlighted in the auditor's audit of the division. (HB492 HD2)</p>	<p>PGM, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 130, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR763)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO COMMUNITY REINTEGRATION. Requires the Department of Public Safety to determine the number of women who are eligible for reintegration into the community and contract with providers of gender-responsive community services to assist women in successfully transitioning back into the community. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB130 HD1)</p>	<p>PGM, WAM</p>
