Status calendar year 2010. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1089 HD1)

HB 1180, HD1 RELATING TO TAXATION. WAM

(HSCR831)Imposes conveyance tax on the transfer of a controlling interest of an
entity with an interest in real property. Stipulates that the impositionTestimonyof the conveyance tax on transfers of entity ownership shall not apply
to any transfer of interest or acquisition between entities wholly owned
by the same common ownership that results in no change in the

beneficial ownership. Imposes the conveyance tax on certain transfers

of real property at the lowest tax rate. (HB1180 HD1)

HB 79, HD1 RELATING TO STATE FUNDS. WAM

(HSCR677) Repeals, terminates, or closes certain revolving and trust funds.

Requires agencies to report to the 2012 Legislature on their non-

<u>Testimony</u> general funds. (HB79 HD1)

Status

HB 1270, HD1 RELATING TO TAXATION. WAM

(HSCR675)

Requires the Department of Taxation to evaluate certain tax credits and tax exemptions and report to the Legislature. Provides automatic repeal of the tax credits and tax exemptions. (HB1270 HD1)

Status

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
