My name is Mervina K. M. Cash-Kaeo and I am the President/CEO of ALU LIKE, Inc. ALU LIKE, Inc. is the current Office of Hawaiian Affairs provider for social services to their beneficiaries. As such ALU LIKE, Inc. provides statewide and culturally appropriate, information and referral, case counseling and counseling, individual development accounts, financial literacy and financial assistance.

Our services are provided through six offices located on the islands of O'ahu, Kaua'i, Maui, Moloka'i, Lana'i and Hawai'i Island. From July 1, 2009 through December 31, 2010 (the first 18 months of the contract), we have served more than 12,258 beneficiaries in the following areas:

The majority of the beneficiaries served were between the ages of 40 - 59, with children below the age of 10 making up the second highest population served. The age breakdown is as follows:
