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Vice-Chair Har and Members of the Committee:

As a resident of Halawa Heights in Aiea, we live next to or near the unimproved section of Kaimakani Street (original Camp Smith access road). This has become a major safety hazard since neither the State of Hawaii nor City and the County of Honolulu are willing to assume responsibility for the "right-of-way".

Major safety hazards include:

1. Brush and tall grass which grow unabated and are potential fire hazards. They also are a home and breeding ground for cats, rodents and other animals which are a nuisance to area residents.
2. Most of the old "right-of-way" is uninhabited and unsecured so it provides a concealed area for improper and illegal activities such as loitering, drinking and drugs.
3. A "river" forms during heavy rains and floods low-lying areas and erodes hillsides next to homes.
4. The old "right-of-way" is used for dumping rubbish and bulky items and parking abandoned vehicles.
5. Gus Webling Elementary School is next to the old "right-of-way" and we worry about the safety of our children.

For these reasons, we strongly urge approval of HCR78 and HR71 so jurisdiction is resolved and the unimproved section of Kaimakani Street is properly maintained and area residents will be much safer.
