### The "Go Beyond" Project

GO BEYOND is a community outreach service project targeting Hawaii's youth ages 12-18+ yrs. recently launched by HPFL CARES in an effort to communicate the new league's motto:

He Lankila Mau.... "Always A Winner."

As a public relations and promotions initiative of the **Hawaii Pro Football League**, **HPFL** *CARES* is also a 501(c)3 non-profit in the State of Hawaii and consists of players, coaches, staff and cheerleaders reaching-out to Hawaii's youth as helpful mentors and positive role models. HPFL's core message is simple but profound: "WHO YOU ARE IS POSSIBILITY...We are here to encourage you to move beyond negative, victim thinking to positive, opportunity thinking so you can achieve your personal best in life!"

Being an athlete associated with a professional sport is not always about the glory that comes with winning, it's also about one's character, preparation and the sacrifices that go into being successful. Four professional football teams are playing in the HPFL at several different high schools around OAHU. By presenting the opportunity to meet players and coaches while enjoying "on-the-field" and "behind-the-scenes" action at football games, the **GO BEYOND Project** will give students access to hometown heroes and positive role-models.

HPFL CARES also intends to send coaches and football players out to local schools to help keep students motivated in the classroom by communicating clear and concise principles of success that apply on and off the field. School presentations will encourage students to go beyond their current mind-set and belief systems to become the best they can be by listening better, studying more, helping others, overcoming obstacles and making a difference right now. A secondary topic to be addressed will be bullying and other negative behaviors associated with fear, anger and revenge that lead to aggressive behavior. The core concept of the program is the idea that positive role-models clearly make a difference in the lives of youth. By motivating them to GO BEYOND real challenges in their lives, they can get closer to achieving their dreams. Also, by giving students access to the football players at their games, they are not solely spectators, but they become more involved in the sport which can inspire them to want to be part of a team and eager to adopt a winning attitude.

Dear Kalei:

HPFL CARES media and promotions director, Monica Roberts spoke with you today regarding a request to restore water for one of our student program participants, Jeremiah M. Jeremiah is one of four children (ages 4, 9, 13, 18) living with his single mother Liza in Kapolei, Hawaii. Although the family contacted the Board of Water on 12/9/10 to request a payment plan to keep their water turned-on, your office policy states that once the water is turned-off for a residence, only payment in full is accepted to return service. The family could not afford to pay the balance in full as it was over \$1,000. Therefore, they have been without water for more than 14 weeks now (since December 9, 2010).

As part of the HPFL CARE'S community outreach with children, our organization is concerned about the stress and impact of not having running water on the entire family and is choosing to help them get their water restored. As discussed on the phone today, our organization will assume payment in full on their behalf to the Board of Water Supply, City and County of Honolulu. The amount due includes a \$10 "turn-on fee" which accounts for a total amount due of \$1,087.90. The HPFL CARES program will work with our sponsors and Monica Roberts to pay this amount in 6 installment payments:

### 1st payment = \$182.90 / 2nd thru 6th payments = \$181 each: April, May, June, July, August, 2011

Please keep in mind that we will be securing sponsor donations immediately and expect to pay this amount in full sooner than August 2011. However, as a new league and program we feel it is in our best interest to commit to making a total of six installment payments to the Board of Water Supply.

We appreciate your willingness to work with our organization to help Jeremiah's family have their water restored and to help prevent any future problems or potential emergency situation that might occur due to having no running water at the family's residence.

PFL Commissioner, Carson Peapealalo is passionate about football and working with talented and motivated young people in Hawaii. He had a vision to develop the Hawaii Professional Football League concept after several years of discussions with friends, relatives, mentors and business associates. Carson solidified the business plan to form a nonprofit corporation to kick-off the Hawaii Pro Football League with the help of Marketing Director, Tony Lorenzo, and built his staff with careful consideration and multiple contacts. His primary goal is to find sponsors and conduct fundraising events that will attract local businesses to

support the new professional football league. As a non-profit entity – all contributions are tax-deductible. Also, on a personal level Carson maintains contact with and seeks the advice of prominent local players in the National Football League (NFL).

### "SERVICE BEFORE SELF"

Carson was born and raised in Kahana Valley nearby Oahu's North Shore, regarded as "Football Country" to many locals. From 1979-1983, he played the positions of Running Back (RB) and Safety (S) for football powerhouse Kahuku High School, before heading to Bringham Young University (BYU) at Idaho from 1987-1989. Three years later, Carson retained his RB skills as he played for the University of Hawaii Warriors from 1992-1994 under Head Coach Bob Wagner. In 1995, he left Hawaii for Texas to tryout for the Dallas Cowboys under the tutelage of Scout Coach Jim Garrett, Sr. However, a lingering injury prevented his chances of attaining a free agent contract, and Carson would return home to play for the semi-professional leagues, most notably the Hawaii Football League (HFL), which eventually ceased operations in 2005.

After years on the local semi-pro circuit, Carson personally designed Defensive and Offensive schemes to win two (2) Marine Corps Tackle Football League (MCTFL) championships in 2006 and 2008. He even trained a player with no prior experience to become a "Most Valuable Player" (MVP). That MVP is now a bona fide Hawaii Professional Football League (HPFL) Team Owner. Over a span of four years, Carson's coaching record was 34-5.

"Service Before Self" is a motto that Carson proudly lives by. His personal commitment to help people is reflected in Rotary-sponsored community service activities and volunteer tasks. The experience, contributions, and network of contacts Carson Peapealalo has cultvated are unmatched, and more than qualifies him to lead the Hawaii Professional Football League as their first Commissioner.

True to his local ties and love of the Hawaiian culture, outside of work, Carson provides entertainment as a Polynesian dancer, bringing excitement to countless parties, weddings and birthdays. His well-rounded personality and strong work ethic makes Carson Peapealalo the perfect person to take on the challenge of building a long-term Hawaii
