# BUDGET BRIEFING TESTIMONY OF THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS BIENNIUM BUDGET REQUEST FOR FISCAL BIENNIUM 2011-2013

TWENTY-SIXTH LEGISLATURE REGULAR SESSION JANUARY 14, 2011

TO THE HONORABLE DAVID IGE, CHAIR AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Amy Asselbaye, Chief of Staff for the Office of the Governor. Thank you for this opportunity to present and discuss the budget for our office for Fiscal Biennium 2011-2013.

I am here to present the budget as put forward in the December 20, 2010 budget submittal. The details for the emergency appropriation for the remainder of Fiscal Year (FY) 2011 are still being worked on, as are the details for the next two fiscal years.

The emergency appropriation will be submitted by the Senate President and the Speaker by request on January 24, 2011. The Governor respectfully requests hearings in both the Senate and the House and I look forward to providing public testimony with regard to our emergency appropriation request at that time. Additionally, there will be Governor's Messages coming forth which will provide further details of our biennium request.

Thank you for the opportunity to work with the Committee and staff on the Governor's office budget and for your consideration as we proceed.

#### **Mission Statement**

The Office of the Governor's focus is to guide Hawaii towards a more prosperous future by providing executive direction for policy development, program coordination, communications, planning and budgeting.

#### **Economic Impact**

Overall policy direction for State agencies and communication to the public on all State matters are the primary functions of the Office of the Governor. In the upcoming biennium budget, the Governor's office will provide leadership to execute the recovery and reinvestment plan by:

- » Reconfiguring, retooling and strengthening our fractured government services to become a better partner with the private economy and to better serve our people;
- » Creating jobs with a significant capital improvement program that simultaneously improves the infrastructure and economic landscape for sustained economic and social advancement;

- » Pursuing every federal funding and private partnership opportunity to supplement state efforts in all sectors; and
- » Consistently investing whatever means we have into factors that will sustain our long-term economic and social well-being—clean energy, food security, technology, education, good health and other aspects of our human capital.

#### **Alternatives Considered**

The Office of the Governor will continue to evaluate expenditures to look for efficiencies while seeking to fulfill its core mission. For example, we will utilize information technology to increase productivity with a smaller statewide workforce.

#### **Budget Summary**

The Office of the Governor is different than other departments in that the entire workforce of the Office has been replaced as a result of the gubernatorial transition. Human resources and budget personnel were not carried over from the prior Office of the Governor, so a more detailed comparison to the previous staff and resources is not available to us.

To fulfill our office mission, we are not reducing hours of operation even with the limited staffing currently funded. Specifically, as the State Operator no longer exists, those calls are being routed to our constituent services office, which handled roughly 400 requests in the first month and is staffed by a Director and assistant who also have other duties including tours, proclamations, messages, flag requests, etc. Due to the existing budget shortfall, necessary positions are currently unfilled including protocol officer, who manages interactions with visiting dignitaries, Neighbor Island Governor's Representatives and Constituent Services Representatives, as well as policy analyst positions, among others.

The Office of the Governor is also pursuing public-private partnerships to supplement general fund resources for staffing and Washington Place. And, we have been utilizing volunteers for constituent services support, our reception areas, Boards & Commissions assistance, Neighbor Island offices, and Capitol tours. Any creative idea to serve the core mission and the public better within existing resources will be considered.

Looking forward, we will certainly be very willing to provide the Committee any information that may be requested.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony. My staff and I would be pleased to answer any questions you may have.
