STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 46

Honorable Members Twenty-Sixth Legislature State of Hawaii

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill No. 46, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Public Housing."

The stated purpose of this bill is to prohibit smoking of tobacco or any other plant material in all public housing projects, state and federal, owned and administered by the Hawaii Public Housing Authority. The bill would ban smoking within the residential units, designated common areas, and within twenty feet of any building, and smoking would only be allowed in designated smoking areas that are not within twenty feet of any building. The bill would take effect upon my approval.

I agree with the underlying objective of the bill. Smoking is a public health issue and we should encourage our citizens to stop, but I agree with the Hawaii Public Housing Authority that implementing an incremental ban throughout the housing projects within the next twelve months is a practical path to a successful plan. It is a fact that a number of the residents are chronic smokers and it would be difficult to expect them to stop immediately. Further, establishing designated smoking areas runs counter to what is desired for making public housing smoke-free.

The Authority has already held meetings and discussions with various tenant associations at the housing projects to provide sufficient notice to the residents of the coming smoking ban, and has established a schedule of when specific housing projects will be required to implement the smoking ban. Additionally, the Authority is already drafting proposed administrative rules to implement the smoking ban consistent with the provisions of the bill. Accordingly, I believe the Authority should be allowed the

opportunity to continue to implement the objective of the bill using its own administrative discretion.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 46 without my

approval.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TON 1. Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part I to be appropriately	
3	designate	d and to read as follows:

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- 1 within the public housing project or state low-income housing 2 project. 3 (c) For purposes of this section: 4 "Common areas" means those portions of the land, building, 5 and all appurtenances and easements that are available for use 6 by tenants or as designated by the authority as a common area. 7 "Smoking" means inhaling or exhaling the fumes of tobacco or any other plant material, or burning or carrying any smoking 8 9 paraphernalia for tobacco or any other plant material that is 10 lit." SECTION 2. Section 356D-92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: Except as otherwise provided, the authority may 13 terminate any lease, rental agreement, permit, or license 14 15 covering the use and occupation of any dwelling unit or other premises located within a public housing project and evict from 16 17 any premises any tenant, licensee, or other occupant for any of 18 the following reasons: Failure to pay rent when due; 19 (1) Violation of any of the provisions of a lease, rental 20 (2) 21 agreement, permit, or license;
 - (3) Violation of any of the rules of the authority;
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1	(4)	Failure to maintain the dwelling unit in a clean,
2		sanitary, and habitable condition; [ex]
3	<u>(5)</u>	Upon a third violation of section 356D- ; provided
4		that a violation by a non-resident who is visiting a
5		resident shall be deemed a violation by the resident
6		only if the resident is within twenty feet of the
7		visitor at the time of the violation; or
8	[(5)]	(6) The existence of any other circumstances giving
9		rise to an immediate right to possession by the
10		authority."
11	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
12	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
13	begun bef	ore its effective date.
14	SECT	ION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
