## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUSINESS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read as	follows:
4		"PART . UNLICENSED CONTRACTING OFFENSES
5	§708-	A Unlicensed contracting activity. (a) A person
6	commits th	e offense of unlicensed contracting activity if the
7	person:	
8	(1)	Engages in any activity that requires a contractor's
9		license under chapter 444 and is not a licensed
10		contractor when engaging in the activity; or
11	(2)	Uses any word, title, or representation to induce the
12		false belief that the person is licensed under chapter
13		444 to engage in contracting activity.
14	(b)	Unlicensed contracting activity shall be a misdemeanor
15	offense an	d punishable pursuant to chapter 707.

(c) Each day of unlicensed contracting activity shall be

considered a separate offense.

- 6 §708-B Habitual unlicensed contracting activity; felony.
- 7 (a) A person commits the offense of habitual unlicensed
- 8 contracting activity if the person is a habitual unlicensed
- 9 contracting activity offender and:
- 10 (1) Engages in any activity for which a contractor's
- 11 license is required under chapter 444, and is not
- 12 licensed as a contractor under chapter 444 when
- engaging in the activity; or
- 14 (2) Uses any work, title, or representation to induce the
- false belief that the person is licensed under chapter
- 444 to engage in contracting activity.
- (b) For the purposes of this section, a person is a
- 18 "habitual unlicensed contracting activity offender" if the
- 19 person, at the time of the conduct for which the person is
- 20 charged, has had two or more convictions within ten years
- 21 preceding the instant offense for unlicensed contracting
- 22 activity in violation of sections 436B-27 or 708-A.

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- 1 (c) A conviction for purposes of this section is a
- 2 judgment on a verdict, a finding of guilt, or a judgment on a
- 3 plea of quilty or nolo contendere. The convictions shall have
- 4 occurred on separate dates and be for separate incidents on
- 5 separate dates. At the time of the instant offense, the
- 6 convictions shall not have been expunded by pardon, reversed, or
- 7 set aside.
- 8 (d) Habitual unlicensed contracting activity is a class C
- 9 felony.
- (e) It is an affirmative defense under this section that
- 11 the offense consisted of unlicensed activity performed by a
- 12 licensed contractor outside the scope of the contractor's
- 13 license. This defense shall not preclude any administrative or
- 14 civil enforcement action for the unlicensed activity.
- 15 §708-C Unlicensed contractor fraud. (a) A person commits
- 16 the offense of unlicensed contractor fraud if the person is an
- 17 unlicensed contractor and, with intent to defraud, engages in an
- 18 act, practice, or course of business that operates or would
- 19 operate as a fraud or deceit upon another person.
- 20 (b) Unlicensed contractor fraud is a class A felony if the
- 21 total value of all moneys and any assets of value paid or lost

- 1 by the victims pursuant to the same scheme, plan, or
- 2 representations, is not less than \$100,000.
- 3 (c) Unlicensed contractor fraud is a class B felony if the
- 4 total value of all moneys and any assets of value paid or lost
- 5 by the victims pursuant to the same scheme, plan, or
- 6 representations, is \$5,000 or more but less than \$100,000.
- 7 (d) Unlicensed contractor fraud is a class C felony if the
- 8 total value of all moneys and any assets of value paid or lost
- 9 by the victims pursuant to the same scheme, plan, or
- 10 representations, is less than \$5,000.
- (e) For purposes of this section, "unlicensed contractor"
- 12 means a person who engages in any activity for which a
- 13 contractor's license is required under chapter 444 and is not
- 14 licensed as a contractor under chapter 444 when the person
- 15 engages in the activity."
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 436B-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 18 "(b) Any person, who engages in an activity requiring a
- 19 license issued by the licensing authority and who fails to
- 20 obtain the required license, or who uses any word, title, or
- 21 representation to induce the false belief that the person is
- 22 licensed to engage in the activity, other than a circumstance of

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- 1 first instance involving the inadvertent failure to renew a
- 2 previously existing license, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor
- 3 [and-be-subject-to-a-fine of not more \$1,000 imprisoned not more
- 4 than one year, or both, and each [day's-violation] day of
- 5 unlicensed activity shall be deemed a separate offense."
- 6 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 7 5 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 8 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 9 the new sections in this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.

## Description:

Establishes unlicensed contracting activity as a misdemeanor offense; establishes habitual unlicensed contracting activity and unlicensed contractor fraud as felonies. Requires that each day of unlicensed contracting activity be deemed a separate offense. (HD1)
