
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SERVICES FOR SURVIVORS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 371K, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3 to read as follows:

4 **"PART . SERVICES FOR SURVIVORS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING**

5 **§371K-A Definitions.** As used in this part:

6 "Human trafficking survivor" means a person who has had or
7 now has the condition or status of debt bondage, involuntary
8 servitude, severe forms of trafficking in persons, or sex
9 trafficking as defined in Section 102 of the Victims of
10 Trafficking and Violence Protection Act of 2000, 22 United
11 States Code Chapter 78, Section 7102, as amended.

12 "Pre-certified victim of human trafficking" means a person
13 who has a pending application for federal certification as a
14 victim of a severe form of trafficking in persons as defined in
15 22 United States Code 7102 (Trafficking Victims Protection) but
16 has not yet obtained such certification, or a person who has
17 reported a crime to law enforcement and it reasonably appears to
18 law enforcement that the person is such a victim.



1 **§371K-B Services for victims of human trafficking.** (a)

2 The office of community services shall coordinate with and
3 assist law enforcement agencies, the county prosecutors'
4 offices, the attorney general's office, and the department of
5 human services to access appropriate services for human
6 trafficking survivors.

7 (b) In providing such assistance, the office of community
8 services may enter into contracts with non-government
9 organizations for providing services to pre-certified victims of
10 human trafficking as defined in section 371K-A, insofar as funds
11 are available for that purpose. Such services may include, case
12 management, emergency temporary housing, health care, mental
13 health counseling, drug addiction screening and treatment,
14 language interpretation and translation services, english
15 language instruction, job training and placement assistance,
16 post-employment services for job retention, transportation
17 services and services to assist the individual and any of his or
18 her family members to establish a permanent residence in the
19 State of Hawaii or the United States. Nothing in this section
20 shall preclude the office of community services, or any local
21 social services agency, from providing human trafficking victims
22 who are United States citizens or human trafficking survivors as



1 defined in this part with any benefits and services for which
2 they may otherwise be eligible. All funds and services
3 delivered through this provision shall be supplementary to, and
4 shall not duplicate benefits provided by federal government
5 programs designed to assist survivors of human trafficking.

6 **§371K-C Confirmation as a survivor of human trafficking.**

7 (a) As soon as practicable after a first encounter with a
8 person who reasonably appears to a law enforcement agency or a
9 district attorney's office to be a human trafficking survivor,
10 that agency or office shall notify the office of community
11 services and the division of criminal justice services that such
12 person may be eligible for services under this part.

13 (b) Upon receipt of such a notification, the division of
14 criminal justice services, in consultation with the office of
15 community services and the referring agency or office shall make
16 a preliminary assessment of whether such survivor or possible
17 survivor appears to meet the criteria for certification as a
18 victim of a severe form of trafficking in persons as defined in
19 22 United States Code 7102 (Trafficking Victims Protection) or
20 appears to be otherwise eligible for any federal, state, or
21 local benefits and services. If it is determined that the
22 survivor appears to meet such criteria, the office of temporary



1 and disability assistance shall report the finding to the
2 survivor, and to the referring law enforcement agency or the
3 attorney general's office, and may assist that agency or office
4 in having such survivor receive services from a case management
5 provider who may be under contract with the office of community
6 services or from any other available source. If the victim or
7 possible survivor is under the age of eighteen, the office of
8 community services also shall notify the department of human
9 services of the minor survivor.

10 **§371K-D Law enforcement assistance with respect to**
11 **immigration.** Upon the request of a human trafficking victim or
12 a representative of a human trafficking survivor, the State,
13 local law enforcement agency, or district attorney's office
14 shall provide the victim with the United States Citizenship and
15 Immigration Service (USCIS) Form I-914 Supplement B Declaration
16 of Law Enforcement Officer for Survivor of Trafficking in
17 Persons. To provide persuasive evidence, the state or local law
18 enforcement agency endorsement must contain a description of the
19 victimization upon which the application is based, including the
20 dates the trafficking in persons occurred. The endorsement must
21 address whether the survivor had been recruited, harbored,
22 transported, provided, or obtained specifically for either labor



1 servitude or services or for the purposes of a commercial sex
2 act as defined in subdivision three of Section 7102 of Title 22
3 of the United States Code.

4 **§371K-E Rules and Regulations.** The director of the
5 department of labor and industrial relations may adopt rules
6 pursuant to chapter 91 for the implementation and enforcement of
7 this part."

8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to provide
11 services for human trafficking survivors.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13 labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.

14 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
15 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
16 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
17 the new sections in this Act.



1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
