
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CORRECTIONAL INDUSTRIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 354D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "**§354D-4 Powers and duties of the director.** Under the
4 supervision of the director or the director's designee, the
5 administrator of the correctional industries program shall:

6 (1) Develop programs generating revenue that best sustains
7 their operation and allows for capital investment, and
8 reimburses the general fund, when possible, for the
9 expense of correctional services;

10 (2) Develop programs providing the maximum level of work
11 and training opportunities for qualified, able-bodied
12 inmates;

13 (3) Develop programs assuming responsibility for training
14 qualified, able-bodied inmates in general work and
15 specific training skills that increase their
16 employment prospects after release;

17 (4) Develop programs in which inmates can learn skills
18 used in the construction and other industries, while

1 providing low-cost construction, renovation, and
2 repairs of facilities, grounds, furniture, vehicles,
3 and equipment for private, nonprofit social services,
4 health, or education agencies and programs;

5 (5) Acquire or purchase equipment, materials, supplies,
6 office space, insurance, and services necessary to
7 establish and maintain programs pursuant to this
8 chapter;

9 (6) Use labor services of qualified, able-bodied inmates
10 in the manufacture or production of goods and services
11 that are needed for the construction, operation, or
12 maintenance of any office, department, institution, or
13 agency supported in whole or in part by the State, the
14 counties, or the federal government;

15 (7) Use labor services of qualified, able-bodied inmates
16 in the manufacture or production of agricultural goods
17 from penal farms, which may be used to feed prisoners
18 and other wards of the State or sold for profit;

19 ~~(7)~~ (8) Sell all goods and services to the State, the
20 counties, or the federal government;

21 ~~(8)~~ (9) Sell uniforms and uniform accessories to state-
22 employed adult corrections officers;
