A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 183, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read a	s follows:
4		"PART . SANDALWOOD
5	§183	-A Duties; sandalwood. In addition to the duties
6	listed in	section 183-1.5, the department shall:
7	(1)	Support reforestation efforts throughout the State for
8		all native sandalwood species with the objective of
9		replenishing native sandalwood species forests to the
10		level that those forests existed in 1777;
11	(2)	Provide incentives to local entrepreneurs to cultivate
12		native sandalwood species in plantations for either
13		reforestation programs or commercial operations;
14	(3)	Provide support for programs that ensure the
15		sustainability of commercial sandalwood operations in
16		the State;
17	(4)	Enforce penalties against persons who violate this
18		part; and

1	(5)	Establish rules regarding the issuance of permits for
2		harvesting or destroying a native sandalwood species
3		tree.

- 4 §183-B Identification; destruction, harvesting, or
- 5 exporting of sandalwood trees. (a) The department shall
- 6 identify native sandalwood tree species in the State.
- 7 (b) It shall be unlawful to destroy or harvest a tree of a
- 8 native sandalwood species identified by the department pursuant
- 9 to subsection (a) without a permit issued by the department.
- 10 (c) Any person who destroys or harvests a native
- 11 sandalwood species tree shall replant native sandalwood species
- 12 trees in an amount determined by the department, which shall
- 13 monitor the replanting efforts and the success rate of the
- 14 seedlings that are replanted.
- (d) It shall be unlawful to export raw or unprocessed
- 16 timber of any native sandalwood species outside the State except
- 17 with a permit issued by the department.
- (e) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 19 91 to effectuate the purposes of this section.
- 20 §183-C Permits. (a) Subject to chapter 91, the department
- 21 shall adopt rules regarding the issuance of a permit to destroy
- 22 or harvest a tree of a native sandalwood species described in



- 1 section 183-B(a) or to export raw or unprocessed timber of any
- 2 native sandalwood species outside the State. The rules shall
- 3 include provisions for:
- 4 (1) Requirements to obtain a permit;
- 5 (2) Duration of a permit;
- **6** (3) Terms of a permit; and
- 7 (4) Disqualifications that will prevent the approval of a
- 8 permit.
- 9 (b) No original permit or license for the harvesting,
- 10 destruction, or exportation outside of the State of any native
- 11 sandalwood species not described in section 183-B(a) shall be
- 12 issued by any officer or agency of the State without the prior
- 13 approval and concurrence of the department. In determining
- 14 whether to grant or withhold such approval, the department shall
- 15 be guided by the standards set forth in chapter 183C.
- 16 §183-D Fees. (a) Any person who holds a permit issued
- 17 pursuant to section 183-B(b) who harvests trees of a native
- 18 sandalwood species for commercial purposes shall pay to the
- 19 department a fee equal to per cent of the dollar value of
- 20 the sandalwood or sandalwood products harvested or sold and
- 21 shall pay a processing fee of \$

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         (b) All fees except processing fees collected pursuant to
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    subsection (a) shall be deposited in the treasury of the State
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    for use by the department for forestry purposes and all such
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    sums as may be so collected and deposited are appropriated for
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    those purposes. Processing fees collected under subsection (a)
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    shall be deposited into the forest stewardship fund established
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    under section 195F-4 to support forest management and
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    restoration.
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         §183-E Criminal penalties. Any person who violates
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    section 183-B, upon conviction thereof, shall be guilty of a
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    misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than $
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    imprisoned not more than one year, or both. In addition to any
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    other penalty imposed under this section, fines and penalties in
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    accordance with sections 183-5 and 183-18 shall be levied for
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    each tree illegally destroyed or harvested under section 183-B.
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    Fines collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited into
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    the forest stewardship fund established under section 195F-4.

                  Definitions. As used in this part, "native
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    sandalwood species" or "native sandalwood tree species" means
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    those tree species of the genus Santalum identified by the
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    department as currently existing in the State."
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- 1 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 5 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 6 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 7 the new sections in this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
