A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that third parties,
- 2 including hotels, liquor establishments, and retail stores often
- 3 scan driver's licenses and identification cards to determine
- 4 identity and age. Some of these third parties retain the
- 5 scanned personal information for other purposes. Law-
- 6 enforcement officers scan driver's licenses to retrieve data and
- 7 to issue electronic citations. Third parties, with the
- 8 exception of use by law-enforcement officers for solely official
- 9 purposes, should not be allowed to retain personally
- 10 identifiable information stored in the machine-readable zone of
- 11 a scanned driver's license or identification card without the
- 12 express consent of the holder of the driver's license or
- 13 identification card. The Department of Homeland Security
- 14 concurs that states should adopt a law limiting retention of
- 15 personally identifiable information scanned from driver's
- 16 license and identification cards.

16		person's possession any canceled, revoked, suspended,	
17		fictitious, or fraudulently altered driver's license;	
18	(2)	Lend the person's driver's license to any other person	
19		or knowingly permit the use thereof by another;	
20	(3)	Display or represent as one's own any driver's license	
21		not issued to the person;

1	(4)	Fail or refuse to surrender to the examiner of
2		drivers, upon the examiner's lawful demand, any
3		driver's license that has been suspended, revoked, or
4		canceled;
5	(5)	Use a false or fictitious name in any application for
6		a driver's license or knowingly make a false statement
7		or knowingly conceal a material fact, or otherwise
8		commit a fraud in any such application;
9	(6)	Use or have in the person's possession any
10		reproduction, imitation, or facsimile of any driver's
11		license or any identification with the appearance of a
12		driver's license; or
13	<u>(7)</u>	Scan and retain personally identifiable information
14		stored in the machine-readable zone of a driver's
15		license, without the express consent of the holder of
16		the driver's license, unless the use is by law-
17		enforcement officers for solely official purposes."
