
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIGARETTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that reduced ignition
2 propensity cigarettes are expected to reduce accidental fires
3 and related personal injury and property damage caused by
4 cigarette smoking. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate
5 funds for the implementation of the reduced ignition propensity
6 cigarette certification pursuant to section 132C-4, Hawaii
7 Revised Statutes.

8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the temporary
9 deposits account in the trust fund of the department of labor
10 and industrial relations the sum of \$400,000 or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 to be deposited to
12 the credit of the reduced ignition propensity cigarette program
13 special fund established pursuant to section 132C-9, Hawaii
14 Revised Statutes.

15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the reduced
16 ignition propensity cigarette program special fund the sum of
17 \$400,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
18 2012-2013 for the purpose of funding one full-time



1 administrator, one full-time assistant, and other costs of
2 fulfilling the requirements of section 132C-4, Hawaii Revised
3 Statutes.

4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
5 labor and industrial relations.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
