
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FUEL TAX.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 243-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- "§243-6 Fuel taxes, dispositions. (a) The "city and 3
- county of Honolulu fuel tax" shall be paid by the department of 4
- taxation into the state treasury, and shall, by the state 5
- 6 director of finance, be paid over to the director of finance of
- the city and county of Honolulu for deposit into the fund known 7
- as the "highway fund" created by section 249-18. 8
- The "county of Kauai fuel tax" shall be paid by the 9 (b)
- department into the state treasury, and shall, by the state **10**
- 11 director of finance, be paid over to the director of finance of
- 12 the county of Kauai for deposit into the fund known as the
- 13 "highway fund" created by section 249-18.
- (c) The "county of Hawaii fuel tax" shall be paid by the 14
- department into the state treasury, and shall, by the state 15
- director of finance, be paid over to the director of finance of 16
- 17 the county of Hawaii for deposit into the fund known as the
- 18 "highway fund" created by section 249-18.





- 1 The "county of Maui fuel tax" collected on account of liquid fuel sold or used on the island of Lanai or sold 2 elsewhere for ultimate use on the island of Lanai, shall be paid 3 4 by the department into the state treasury, and shall, by the state director of finance, be paid over to the director of 5 finance of the county of Maui for deposit into the fund known as 6 the "highway fund" created by section 249-18, for expenditure on 7 the island of Lanai. The "county of Maui fuel tax" collected on 8 account of liquid fuel sold or used on the island of Molokai or 9 sold elsewhere for ultimate use on the island of Molokai, shall 10 be paid by the department into the state treasury, and shall, by 11 12 the state director of finance, be paid over to the director of finance of the county of Maui for deposit into the fund known as 13 14 the "highway fund" created by section 249-18, for expenditure on the island of Molokai. The remainder of the "county of Maui 15 fuel tax" shall be paid by the department into the state 16 treasury, and shall, by the state director of finance, be paid 17 over to the director of finance of the county of Maui for 18 deposit into the fund known as the "highway fund" created by 19
- (e) Each of the foregoing taxes shall be expended for thefollowing purposes, for the island for which the tax revenue is

- 3 (1) For payment of interest on and redemption of any bonds 4 duly issued or sold on or after July 1, 1951, under 5 chapter 47 for the financing or aiding in financing the construction of county highway tunnels, approach 6 roads thereto, and highways. Such payments of 7 8 interest and principal on the bonds when due, shall be first charges on such moneys so deposited in the 9 10 fund [-];
- 11 (2) For acquisition, designing, construction,

 12 reconstruction, improvement, repair, and maintenance

 13 of county main and general thoroughfares, highways,

 14 and other streets, street lights, storm drains, and

 15 bridges, including costs of new land therefor, when

 - (3) In the case of the city and county of Honolulu, for payment of the city and county's share in an improvement district initiated by the city and county for an improvement listed in paragraph (2) [above]

3	(4)	For the construction of county highway tunnels,				
4		overpasses, underpasses, and bridges, where such				
5		improvement cannot be made under state-federal aid				
6		projects[-];				
7	(5)	For purposes and functions connected with county				
8		traffic control and preservation of safety upon the				
9		public highways and streets[+];				
10	(6)	For purposes and functions in connection with mass				
11		transit[-];				
12	(7)	For acquisition, design, construction, improvement,				
13		repair, and maintenance of bikeways $[-]$;				
14	(8)	No expenditure shall be made, out of the revenues paid				
15		into any such fund, which will jeopardize federal aid				
16		for highway construction[-]; and				
17	(9)	In the case of the county of Hawaii, for the repair				
18		and maintenance of substandard private subdivision				
19		roads in the county of Hawaii."
