RELATING TO COMPUTER FRAUD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 708-891, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+]\$708-891[+] Computer fraud in the first degree. 4 A person commits the offense of computer fraud in the first 5 degree if the person knowingly, and with intent to defraud, 6 accesses a computer [without authorization and, by means of such 7 conduct, obtains or exerts control over the property of 8 another.], computer system, or computer network with the intent 9 to: 10 (a) Facilitate the commission of a murder in any degree, a 11 class A felony, kidnapping, unlawful imprisonment in any degree, 12 extortion in any degree, any offense under chapter 134, criminal property damage in the first or second degree, escape in any 13 14 degree, any offense under part VI of chapter 710, any offense under section 711-1103, or any offense under chapter 842; or 15 16 (b) Commit the offense of theft in the first degree. 17 (2) In a prosecution for computer fraud in the first 18 degree, it is a defense that the object of the fraud and the

- 6 SECTION 2. Section 708-891.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "[+]\$708-891.5[+] Computer fraud in the second degree.
- 9 (1) A person commits the offense of computer fraud in the
- 10 second degree if the person knowingly, and with the intent to
- 11 defraud[τ]:
- 12 (a) Accesses a computer, computer system, or computer
- 13 network with the intent to commit the offense of theft in the
- 14 second degree; or
- 15 (b) $\underline{T}[t]$ ransfers, or otherwise disposes of, to another, or
- 16 obtains control of, with the intent to transfer or dispose of,
- 17 any password or similar information through which a computer,
- 18 computer system, or computer network may be accessed.
- 19 (2) Computer fraud in the second degree is a class [@] B
- 20 felony."

- 1 SECTION 3. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$708- Computer fraud in the third degree. (1) A
- 5 person commits the offense of computer fraud in the third degree
- 6 if the person knowingly, and with the intent to defraud,
- 7 accesses a computer, computer system, or computer network with
- 8 the intent to commit the offense of theft in the third or fourth
- 9 degree.
- 10 (2) Computer fraud in the third degree is a class C
- 11 felony."
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 13 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 14 begun before its effective date.
- 15 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
