A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BREASTFEEDING IN THE WORKPLACE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 387, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§387- Breastfeeding. (a) No employer, as defined in
- 5 section 378-1, shall prohibit an employee from expressing
- 6 breastmilk during any meal period or other break period required
- 7 by law to be provided by the employer or required by collective
- 8 bargaining agreement.
- 9 (b) Every employer with twenty or more employees shall
- 10 make reasonable efforts to provide a clean location, other than
- 11 a bathroom, where an employee may express breast milk in
- 12 privacy. Every employer covered by this subsection shall post
- 13 notice, as shall be prescribed by the director, of the
- 14 application of this subsection in a conspicuous place accessible
- 15 to employees. An employer who violates this subsection shall be
- 16 fined \$50 for each violation. A civil fine that is ordered
- 17 pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited with the director
- 18 of finance to the credit of the general fund of the State.



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1 (c) For the purposes of this section, "employee" means an 2 individual employed by an employer as defined in section 378-1." 3 SECTION 2. Section 378-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 repealed. 5 ["[\$378-10] Breastfeeding. No employer shall prohibit an 6 employee from expressing breastmilk during any meal period or 7 other break period required by law to be provided by the 8 employer or required by collective bargaining agreement."] 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

Breastfeeding; Labor and Industrial Relations; Wage and Hour Law

Description:

Requires an employer with twenty or more employees to make reasonable efforts to provide a clean location for breastfeeding employees to express breast milk in privacy. Requires covered employers to post a notice pertaining to this provision in a conspicuous location. Establishes a civil fine of \$50 for the failure of an employer to provide a location or post notice. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB2228 HD2)
