BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the American		
2	Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, formerly known as		
3	the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists,		
4	recommends that pelvic examinations undertaken for teaching		
5	purposes should be performed with the specific informed consent		
6	of the patient. The legislature also finds that the American		
7	Medical Association recommends discussing medical student		
8	involvement with patient procedures whenever possible.		
9	The purpose of this Act is to require informed consent in		
10	certain circumstances before performing pelvic examinations for		
11	training purposes on anesthetized or unconscious female		
12	patients.		
13	SECTION 2. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
14	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
15	and to read as follows:		

16 "§453- Pelvic examinations on anesthetized or
