Unauthorized Computer Access; Penalties

Description:

Increases the penalties for: (1) unauthorized computer access in the 1^{st} degree from a class B felony to a class A felony and increases the required value of information obtained from more than \$5,000 to more than \$20,000; (2) unauthorized computer access in the 2^{nd} degree from a class C felony to a class B felony; and (3) unauthorized computer access in the 3^{rd} degree from a misdemeanor to a class C felony.
