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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that current difficult 2 economic conditions warrant the use of incentives to help create 3 job growth and stimulate the State's economy. The legislature also finds that the process for procuring state contracts is 4 5 often cumbersome. The legislature further finds that incentives 6 in the procurement process would lead to more companies bidding 7 for state contracts. This would give the State a broader 8 network of contractors to choose from and would possibly 9 expedite the progress of rebuilding Hawaii's economy and 10 workforce by having a number of companies working on various . 11 state projects.

12 The purpose of this Act is to create price preferences for 13 bids and proposals submitted to procuring agencies by Hawaii 14 small businesses, veterans, and service-disabled veterans.

15 SECTION 2. Section 103D-906, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows:

15	provided	that for purposes of this section, a business shall be

17	service-disabled veteran directly owns at least a fifty-one per		
18	cent interest in the business.		
19	The	rules adopted pursuant to this section shall include	
20	rules for	verifying the status and eligibility of veterans and	
21	service-disabled veterans.

8	(3)	Employs fewer than fifty employees.	
9	"Service-disabled veteran" means a veteran who has a		
10	service-connected disability compensable under title 38 United		
11	States Code section 1110 or 1131 and who meets any other		
12	applicabl	e qualifications established by rule.	
13	"Veteran" means any person who has served in any of the		
14	armed ser	vices of the United States in any war or campaign in	
15	which the	United States was engaged, whose service has been	
16	verified by the:		
17	(1)	United States Department of Veterans Affairs;	
18	(2)	United States Department of Defense;	
19	<u>(3)</u>	United States Coast Guard; or	
20	(4)	National Guard,	
21	and who me	eets any other applicable qualifications established by	

22 <u>rule.</u>"
