A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NOTARIES PUBLIC.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 456-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$456-3 Seal. Every notary public shall constantly keep
- 4 an engraved seal of office or a rubber stamp facsimile seal
- 5 which shall clearly show, when embossed, stamped, or impressed
- 6 upon a document, only the notary's name, the notary's commission
- 7 number, and the words, "notary public" and "State of Hawaii".
- 8 The notary public shall authenticate all the notary's official
- 9 acts, attestations, certificates, and instruments therewith, and
- 10 shall always add to an official signature the typed or printed
- 11 name of the notary and a statement showing the date that the
- 12 notary's commission expires. Upon resignation, death,
- 13 expiration of term of office without reappointment, or removal
- 14 from or abandonment of office, the notary public shall
- 15 immediately deliver the notary's seal to the attorney general
- 16 who shall deface or destroy the same. If any notary fails to
- 17 comply with this section within ninety days of the date of the
- 18 notary's resignation, expiration of term of office without

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- 1 reappointment, or removal from or abandonment of office or if
- 2 the notary's personal representative fails to comply with this
- 3 section within ninety days of the notary's death, then the
- 4 notary public or the notary's personal representative shall
- 5 forfeit to the State not more than \$200, in the discretion of
- 6 the court, to be recovered in an action brought by the attorney
- 7 general on behalf of the State."
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 456-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended follows:
- 10 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- "(a) The attorney general shall charge and collect the
- 12 following fees for:
- 13 (1) Issuing the original commission, [\$40;] \$60; and
- 14 (2) Renewing the commission, [\$40.] \$60.
- 15 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the attorney general may
- 16 establish and adjust fees pursuant to chapter 91."
- 17 2. By amending subsection (c) to read:
- 18 "(c) The attorney general may impose and collect the
- 19 following administrative fines for a notary public's failure to:
- 20 (1) Maintain an official seal of one type, either a single
- 21 engraved seal or a single rubber stamp facsimile seal,
- on which shall be inscribed only the name of the

1		notary public, the commission number of the notary
2		<pre>public, and the words "notary public" and "State of</pre>
3		Hawaii" [only], \$20;
4	(2)	Surrender the notary public's seal and certificate to
5		the attorney general within ninety days of
6		resignation, removal from office, or the expiration of
7		a term without renewal, \$200;
8	(3)	Authenticate every acknowledgment or jurat with a
9		certificate that shall be signed and dated by the
10		notary, include the printed name and official stamp or
11		seal of the notary, identify the jurisdiction in which
12		the notarial act is performed, describe in close
13		proximity to the acknowledgment or jurat the document
14		being notarized, and state the number of pages and
15		date of the document, \$500;
16	(4)	Record all of the notary public's transactions as
17		prescribed by section 456-15 and applicable rules,
18		\$200;
19	(5)	Surrender the notary public's record books to the
20		attorney general within ninety days of the end of the
21		commission, resignation, or removal from office, \$500;
22		and

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1	(6)	Notify the attorney general within ten days after
2		loss, misplacement, or theft of the notary public's
3		seal, stamp, or any record book, inform the
4		appropriate law enforcement agency in the case of
5		theft, and deliver a copy of the law enforcement
6		agency's report of the theft to the attorney general,
7		\$20."

10	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
