#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Human Services

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FEES FOR CHILD CARE LICENSING AND REGISTRATION.

PURPOSE:

To allow the Department of Human Services to charge reasonable fees for a child care license or certificate of registration and establish a special fund into which the fees are to be deposited.

MEANS:

Add a new section to chapter 346 and amend sections 346-163 and 346-173, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Department of Human Services is authorized to license group child care homes and group child care centers and issue certificates of registration for family child care homes. There are administrative costs associated with the licensing and certification activities, including site visits, observation of providers with children, inspections to ensure compliance with administrative rules to ensure the health and safety of the child care operations, and the assessment of the findings.

As with other business entities that are charged licensing and certification fees by other state agencies to conduct a business, the Department of Human Services is proposing to charge a reasonable fee to private business entities who want to operate a child care facility.

Authorization to charge reasonable fees will offset some of the administrative costs associated with issuing licenses and certificates of registration to individuals or business entities who want to care for children.

The fees charged will further ensure the safety of children in child care homes and child care centers by giving the Department resources to maintain the licensing standards.

Establishing a child care licensing and certificate of registration special fund into which the fees will be deposited will provide the Department with resources to ensure the health and safety of children.

Impact on the public: Current and future applicants for a child care license or certificate will be charged a fee for a license or certificate of registration, and may pass on the cost to families who utilize their services.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The Department would have to create the
internal mechanism to collect fees, and
promulgate administrative rules that specify
details of the fees charged and the process
to collect the fees.

The fees charged will further ensure the safety of children in child care homes and child care centers by giving the Department resources to maintain the licensing standards. Depositing the fees into the special account to be administered by the Department will further support this.
