PURPOSE:

To extend the sunset date for the University of Hawaii's exemption from the requirements of chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, with some exceptions.

MEANS:

Amend section 8 of Act 82, Session Laws of

Hawaii (SLH) 2010.

JUSTIFICATION:

This bill would extend the authority granted to the University via Act 82, SLH 2010, to develop internal procurement policies and procedures that are not subject to certain provisions of the Hawaii Public Procurement Code from July 1, 2012, to July 1, 2015. While Act 82 afforded the University a very limited two-year period in which to pilot its revisions to its procurement procedures, the proposed bill would expand this period to a total of five years. Because new construction projects normally take between 2 to 3 years to complete, this expanded window of time would provide the University with a more reasonable period to refine further its procurement procedures and to conduct a more comprehensive evaluation and assessment of the effectiveness of this interim procurement process.
