
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE
FORTY-NINTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue
2 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$18,317,500 or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2012-2013
5 for the purpose of capital improvement projects for the forty-
6 ninth representative district, as follows:

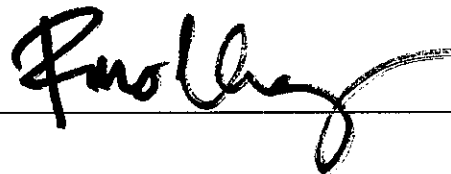
5 SECTION 2. The appropriation made for the capital

7 the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made;
8 provided that all moneys from the appropriation that are
9 unencumbered as of June 30, 2014, shall lapse as of that date.

10 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated for the respective capital
11 improvement projects set forth in section 1 of this Act shall be
12 expended by the designated expending agency for the purposes of
13 this Act.
