RELATING TO PUBLIC FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that the State of Hawaii
3	is still	suffering from the global economic recession. While
4	some Hawa	ii businesses are showing modest signs of recovery, the
5	construction industry, including construction workers, support	
6	staff, and construction-support businesses, is still suffering.	
7	The	legislature further finds that Hawaii is experiencing
8	the lowest interest rates on record and that there were	
9	significant savings from the State's most recent bond	
10	authorization and issuance. In completing the bond transaction,

14	(2)	Kept debt service for fiscal 2012-2013 at

Improved the State's financial position; and 1 (6) Garnered a positive credit rating. 2 (7) The primary economic objective of the legislature this 3 session is to immediately stimulate direct and indirect job 4 creation to maintain and create local construction jobs for all 5 stages of construction, including employment for painters, 6 roofers, electricians, carpenters, architects, engineers, and 7 other consultants to generate more personal income growth. 8 department of business, economic development, and tourism 9 estimates that the last advancement of \$1,800,000,000 in capital 10 improvement projects by the State resulted in the creation of 11 12.9 direct and indirect jobs created for every \$1,000,000 12 13 invested. In contemplating capital improvement projects, the 14 legislature finds that a main focus should include repair and 15 maintenance projects as well as those projects that address 16 This will ensure the existence of health and safety concerns. 17 well-maintained state facilities and infrastructure, which are 18 essential to maintaining a positive business climate and strong 19 economic foundation. Funding would be provided statewide and 20

1 The estimated backlog of repair and maintenance or capital renewal and deferred maintenance projects for the department of 2 education, Hawaii state library system, University of Hawaii, 3 4 University of Hawaii's athletic facilities, department of accounting and general services, department of agriculture, 5 department of defense, department of health, Hawaii health 6 systems corporation, department of human services, department of 7 land and natural resources, department of public safety, and 8 judiciary is well over \$1,000,000,000. 9 Another priority of the legislature is to develop 10 sustainable and renewable energy resources, such as photovoltaic 11 technology, as well as initiatives to improve upon efficient 12 energy consumption. Investing in energy and information 13 technology initiatives throughout schools, hospitals, and office 14 buildings, would have significant impact and ultimately lead to 15 cost savings, alleviating the drain on general funds, and a 16 17 reduction of the State's carbon footprint. 18 The legislature also realizes that the procurement process 19 is lengthy and complicated, which adds considerable time to 20 completing capital improvements and repairs and maintenance in 21 the State's facilities and infrastructure. In order to expedite repair and maintenance projects, this Act provides a procurement 22

Report Title:

Capital Improvement Projects; General Obligations Bonds; Appropriation; Procurement

Description:

Issues general obligation bonds to fund the repair and maintenance or capital renewal and deferred maintenance projects of various departments, the University of Hawaii, Hawaii health systems corporation, and the judiciary. Exempts contracts of less than \$500,000 entered into by the department of education, University of Hawaii, department of accounting and general services, department of agriculture, department of defense, department of health, Hawaii health systems corporation as a body corporate and politic, department of human services, department of land and natural resources, department of public safety, and judiciary from the procurement code. Provides for exemptions from county permitting, licensing, and certification requirements. Makes certain procurement provisions permanent. Requires the procurement policy board to create an expedited procurement process for contracts resulting from appropriations made pursuant to this Act.
