4	(a) It s	hall be unlawful for any person who provides web design							
5	or development services for compensation to:								
6	(1)	Use in the web page or website design or programming							
7		any graphics or other material or software that the							
8		person is not authorized to use, including copyrighted							
9		material;							
10	(2)	Design or program the web page or website to include							
11		material that is not approved by the customer;							
12	(3)	Claim ownership of the web page or website after the							
13		person has completed the job; or							
14	(4)	Use any material at any time obtained from the							
15		customer's computer, including e-mail and e-mail							
16		addresses, without authorization from the customer.

- 2 developer" means a person who designs or creates a web page or
- 3 website, or programs a web page or website, or both."
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.

- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
