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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 171-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3           "**§171-4 Board of land and natural resources; terms and**  
4 **qualifications of members of the board; organization; expenses.**

5       (a) The board of land and natural resources shall be composed  
6 of seven members, one from each land district and three at  
7 large, to be nominated and, by and with the advice and consent  
8 of the senate, appointed by the governor as provided in section  
9 26-34[-]; provided that for the purposes of making  
10 determinations on ocean resources matters, the board shall  
11 consist of eleven members, the additional four ocean resource  
12 members being appointed pursuant to subsections (e) and (f).

13 The term and removal of a member of the board and the filling of  
14 a vacancy on the board shall also be as provided in section 26-

15 34. There shall be not more than three members on the board  
16 from the same political party. At least one member of the board  
17 shall have a background in conservation and natural resources,  
18 as evidenced by:



- 1           (1) A college degree in a relevant field, including  
2           forestry, wildlife conservation, geology,  
3           environmental science, or marine biology; or
- 4           (2) Work history sufficient to demonstrate an appropriate  
5           level of knowledge in the subject of land and natural  
6           resources, including parks and recreation, public  
7           lands management, natural area reserves, aquatic  
8           resources, boating and recreation, forestry and  
9           wildlife, water resources management, or conservation  
10          and resources.
- 11          (b) Each member shall disclose and file with the board a  
12 list of all transactions with the department of land and natural  
13 resources in which the member has a direct interest. The member  
14 shall also disclose all transactions with the department  
15 involving any corporation, association, partnership, or joint  
16 venture in which the member is an officer, partner, or employee.  
17 Any member having any interest, direct or indirect, in any  
18 matter before the board shall disqualify oneself from voting on  
19 or participating in the discussion of the matter.
- 20          (c) The governor shall select a chairperson of the board  
21 from among its members. The chairperson shall call and preside  
22 at meetings and may appoint a member of the board as secretary.



1 The members of the board shall choose one of their number to act  
2 as chairperson during the absence or disability of the  
3 chairperson.

4 (d) The members of the board shall serve without pay but  
5 shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses while  
6 attending meetings and while in the discharge of their duties.

7 (e) The four ocean resources members of the board shall be  
8 appointed by the governor to represent at least four of the  
9 following categories:

10 (1) A fishery science representative with a master of  
11 science or doctorate degree in fisheries science and  
12 experience in Hawaii-based commercial, recreational,  
13 or subsistence fisheries; provided that for the  
14 purposes of this paragraph, a qualifying fishery  
15 science shall not include ecology, marine biology, or  
16 other non-fishery marine science fields;

17 (2) A fishing industry representative with experience in  
18 the commercial fishing industry and active  
19 participation in government agency fishery management  
20 and regulatory processes;

21 (3) A fishing community representative with experience and  
22 working knowledge of Hawaii non-commercial fisheries,




1           including recreation, subsistence, and indigenous  
2           fisheries and active participation in government  
3           fishery management and regulatory processes;  
4       (4) A seafood industry representative with experience and  
5           working knowledge of Hawaii seafood processing and  
6           marketing industry and active participation in  
7           government fishery management and regulatory  
8           processes; and  
9       (5) A marine industry representative with experience in  
10           Hawaii maritime industries of boating, shipping, and  
11           maritime products.  
12       (f) The four ocean resources members, except as otherwise  
13 provided in this subsection, shall be appointed to the board by  
14 the governor pursuant to section 26-34. These four members  
15 shall be considered in determining quorum and majority only on  
16 issues relating to ocean resources and may vote only on issues  
17 related to ocean resources. The political party affiliation of  
18 the four ocean resources members, if any, shall not apply to the  
19 political party limitation in subsection (a), nor shall there be  
20 a limit on the number of ocean resources members from any one  
21 political party."



1 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
