# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO  
IDENTIFY WAYS TO IMPROVE AND ACCELERATE THE PROCESSING OF  
WORKER'S COMPENSATION CLAIMS.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaii workers' compensation law under Chapter  
2 386, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides wage loss compensation  
3 and medical care to employees for work-related injuries; and  
4

5 WHEREAS, workers' compensation claims are processed by the  
6 Disability Compensation Division of the Department of Labor and  
7 Industrial Relations; and  
8

9 WHEREAS, there are concerns that health care providers may  
10 refuse to treat patients with work-related injuries because of  
11 the complex process and time-consuming paperwork for workers'  
12 compensation claims; and  
13

14 WHEREAS, injured workers may not receive treatment in a  
15 timely manner because of difficulties they may have in finding a  
16 health care provider that accepts workers' compensation cases;  
17 and

19 WHEREAS, Hawaii is at risk of losing health care providers  
20 to other states, in part, because workers' compensation claims  
21 are processed more expeditiously in other jurisdictions; and

23 WHEREAS, an evaluation is needed to determine whether the  
24 Disability Compensation Division's processes adequately serve  
25 workers' compensation claimants and facilitate prompt  
26 reimbursements to health care providers; now, therefore,

28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
29 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
30 of 2012, the Senate concurring, that the Director of Labor and  
31 Industrial Relations is requested to identify ways to improve

1 and accelerate the processing of workers' compensation claims by  
2 the Disability Compensation Division of the Department of Labor  
3 and Industrial Relations; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Labor and  
6 Industrial Relations is requested to submit to the Legislature  
7 THE Director's findings and recommendations, including any  
8 proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the  
9 convening of the Regular Session of 2013; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and  
13 Director of Labor and Industrial Relations.
