
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO RECOGNIZE LOCAL KOREANS BY DIRECTING
THE PLACEMENT OF A COMMEMORATIVE PLAQUE DESIGNATING THE
FORMER SITE OF THE KOREAN BOARDING SCHOOL FOR BOYS AND THE
KOREAN METHODIST CHURCH.

1 WHEREAS, beginning with the first group of 102 on the S.S.
2 Gaelic, which arrived at Honolulu Harbor on January 13, 1903,
3 approximately 7,400 Koreans were admitted to Hawaii through
4 August 1905, and the 1910 census listed 4,533 Koreans living in
5 the Hawaiian Islands; and

6
7 WHEREAS, Koreans urged Hawaiian Methodist Mission to
8 establish a school for Korean boys with the assistance of a
9 \$2,000 pledge; and

10
11 WHEREAS, the Korean Boarding School for Boys opened its
12 doors to 65 boys in the fall of 1906 at the old North Pacific
13 Institute, or Doctor Hyde's Theological Seminary on Punchbowl
14 Street near Beretania Street, at the present Kalanimoku Building
15 site; and

16
17 WHEREAS, the Korean Methodist Church was also located at
18 one of the buildings and the site was commonly known as the
19 Korean Compound; and

20
21 WHEREAS, the school changed its name to Korean Central
22 School and admitted female students in the fall of 1913, the
23 first coeducational institution for Koreans in the world; and

24
25 WHEREAS, the school closed its doors in the fall of 1918
26 and the Korean Methodist Church was relocated to Fort Street;
27 and

29 WHEREAS, it is fitting to recognize the location of the
30 Korean Boarding School for Boys and the Korean Methodist Church
31 with a bronze plaque; now, therefore,

2 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
3 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
4 of 2012, the Senate concurring, that the Governor is requested
5 to direct the placement of a commemorative plaque, to be funded
6 by the Korean community, that designates the former site of the
7 Korean Boarding School for Boys and the Korean Methodist Church,
8 as follows:

- 10 (1) The plaque is to be made of bronze, measuring no
11 larger than 24 by 15 inches, to be mounted on 24 inch
12 high pedestals made of stone or cement block;
13
14 (2) The plaque is to be placed at an appropriate site at
15 the Punchbowl Street side of the Kalanimoku Building
16 near the Punchbowl exit; and

18 (3) The plaque is to read in English and Korean "Korean
19 Boarding School for Boys and Korean Methodist Church
20 Site, 1906-1918"; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Historic Preservation
23 Division is requested to work with the Korean National
24 Association in the design of the plaque to ensure that the
25 plaque meets all signage requirements for historic properties;
26 and

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting
29 and General Services is requested to coordinate the installation
30 of the plaque; and

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor,
34 Comptroller, Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural
35 Resources, and Korean National Association.
