HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO EXPAND A SCHOOL GARDEN PROGRAM STATEWIDE.

WHEREAS, according to the National Survey of Children's Health, twenty-eight percent of school-aged children in Hawaii are either overweight or obese, and one in every three children born in the year 2000 in the United States will develop diabetes; and

WHEREAS, the 2003 Food Security Task Force report published by the state Office of Planning noted that over nineteen percent of Hawaii residents live in food insecure households of which most have school-aged children residing; and

WHEREAS, many children in Hawaii have limited exposure to the wide range of locally produced healthy food available and do not know where the food they eat comes from or how their food was produced or prepared; and

WHEREAS, this limited exposure and the mass availability of "junk food" leads to children being susceptible to the ubiquitous marketing of "junk food"; and

WHEREAS, the addition of locally produced fruits and vegetables in school meals will expose Hawaii's school children to high quality, local produce; and

WHEREAS, farm-to-school programs, such as planting and tending school gardens, have proven successful in supplying high quality food and provides students with knowledge to enhance their educational experience and cultivate long-term healthy eating habits; and

WHEREAS, there are several successful alternative farm-to-school programs in Hawaii through public-private partnerships

1 and strong support from local school administrators, food 2 service managers, teachers, parents, and students; and 3 4 WHEREAS, these programs rely on external support from nonprofit organizations, such as the Kokua Hawai'i Foundation's 5 6 'AINA In Schools (Actively Integrating Nutrition and Agriculture 7 In Schools), MA'O Organic Farms, The Kohala Center through its 8 Hawaii School Garden Hui, and the Ulupono Initiative; now, 9 therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 12 13 of 2012, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health through its Healthy Hawaii Initiative is requested to convene a 14 15 School Gardens Task Force to determine how best to expand a 16 school garden program statewide; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall consist of 19 representatives from the following entities: 20 21 (1) The Department of Health's Healthy Hawaii Initiative; 22 (2) 23 The Department of Agriculture; 24 (3) The Department of Education; 25 26 (4)The University of Hawaii College of Tropical 27 28 Agriculture and Human Resources; 29 (5) The University of Hawaii Community Colleges culinary 30 arts programs; 31 32 (6) The Kokua Hawai'i Foundation; 33 34 (7) 35 The Kohala Center Hawai'i Island School Garden Network; 36 (8) The Ulupono Initiative; 37 38 MA'O Organic Farms; and 39 (9) 40 41 (10)The Hawaii Association of Independent Schools; and
