HOUSE RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE VISA IMPROVEMENTS TO STIMULATE INTERNATIONAL TOURISM TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA ACT.

1	WHEREAS, tourism is a vital part of Hawaii's economy; and

3	WHEREAS, the Pacific region is a vast market for new
4	visitors; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, in 2010 more than fifty-four million Chinese
7	citizens traveled abroad; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, in that same year, only eight hundred thousand
10	Chinese visitors traveled to the United States and of those,
11	only sixty-two thousand Chinese visitors traveled to Hawaii; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, reforming the travelers visa process is a cost-
14	effective way to make it easier for more international business
15	and tourists to visit Hawaii and the United States; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, the Visa Improvements to Stimulate International
18	Tourism to the United States of America Act (VISIT USA Act)
19	would establish a five year multiple entry visa for Chinese
20	visitors, extend the time Canadian retirees can stay in the
21	United States, and make other amendments in the visa process
22	that would increase tourism in the United States; and

24	WHEREAS, the average visitor from China staying in Hawaii
25 26	spends approximately \$350 a day, the growth in visitors
26	stimulated by the VISIT USA Act could yield an estimated
27	\$573,000,000 for the State; and
28	WUEDERS the proposed improvements in the VICIE USA Act
29 30	WHEREAS, the proposed improvements in the VISIT USA Act would help make visiting Hawaii more convenient for many
30 31	international visitors, thus providing a significant boost to
32	Hawaii's economy through increased commerce and job growth; now,
