A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that earning a high 2 school diploma is an essential step for young people to become productive members of Hawaii's communities. Children who drop 3 4 out of school or are expelled are unlikely to return to school on their own, so it is essential that these at-risk youth are 5 presented with opportunities that will help them finish their 6 7 high school education. The legislature further finds that the Hawaii National 8 9 Guard Youth Challenge Academy is a good option for young people 10 to complete their high school career. The Academy's program is 11 comprised of a twenty-two week residential phase, followed by a 12 year-long mentoring relationship with a specially trained member from each youth's community. The program's goal is to produce 13 graduates that have the values, life skills, education, and 14 self-discipline necessary to succeed as productive citizens. 15 16 The purpose of this Act is to assist the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy in reaching out to at-risk youth 17 by requiring the department of education to provide the Academy 18



with the names, addresses, and dates of attendance of students 1 2 who have dropped out of high school. SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 4 5 and to read as follows: "§302A- Provision of student information to Hawaii 6 National Guard Youth Challenge Academy. (a) Except as provided 7 in subsections (b) and (c), on or before January 15 and July 15 8 of each year, the department shall submit to the director of the 9 10 Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy a report 11 containing the name, last known address, and dates of attendance 12 of any student who: (1) Is at least sixteen years of age but less than 13 eighteen years of age; 14 (2) Was enrolled but is no longer enrolled in a school in 15 16 the State; 17 Has not provided school transfer or graduation (3) information to the school that the student most 18 19 recently attended; and (4) Has not received a high school diploma or general 20

educational development certificate.

14	(2)	Enrolled in a foreign exchange program;
15	<u>(3)</u>	Enrolled in an early admissions college program;
16	(4)	Participating in a job corps program, an adult basic
17		education program, or an accredited apprenticeship
18		program; or
19	<u>(5)</u>	Excused from school for a reason determined to be
20		acceptable by the department.
21	<u>(d)</u>	The director of the Hawaii National Guard Youth
22	Challenge	Academy shall certify in writing to the department



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- 1 that the information provided pursuant to this section will not
- 2 be disclosed to any other party except as necessary to recruit
- 3 and retain students."
