A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 6, OF THE HAWAII
STATE CONSTITUTION RELATING TO RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS FOR
CANDIDATES FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE STATE LEGISLATURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an
2 amendment to article III, section 6, of the Constitution of the
3 State of Hawaii to require candidates for membership in the
4 state senate or house of representatives to be residents of the
5 district from which they seek to be elected for not less than
6 twelve consecutive months prior to the next general election.

7 SECTION 2. Article III, section 6, of the Constitution of
8 the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:

9 **"QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS**

10 **Section 6.** No person shall be eligible to serve as a
11 member of the senate unless the person has been a resident of
12 the State for not less than three years [7] and a resident of the
13 senatorial district from which the person seeks to be elected
14 for not less than twelve consecutive months prior to the next
15 general election, has attained the age of majority and is, prior
16 to filing nomination papers and thereafter continues to be, a
17 qualified voter of the senatorial district from which the person



1 seeks to be elected; except that in the year of the first
2 general election following reapportionment, but prior to the
3 primary election, an incumbent senator may move to a new
4 district without being disqualified from completing the
5 remainder of the incumbent senator's term. No person shall be
6 eligible to serve as a member of the house of representatives
7 unless the person has been a resident of the State for not less
8 than three years [7] and a resident of the representative
9 district from which the person seeks to be elected for not less
10 than twelve consecutive months prior to the next general
11 election, has attained the age of majority and is, prior to
12 filing nomination papers and thereafter continues to be, a
13 qualified voter of the representative district from which the
14 person seeks to be elected; except that in the year of the first
15 general election following reapportionment, but prior to the
16 primary election, an incumbent representative may move to a new
17 district without being disqualified from completing the
18 remainder of the incumbent representative's term."

19 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
20 be as follows:

21 "Shall every candidate for membership in the state senate
22 and house of representatives be required to be a resident



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1 of the legislative district from which the person seeks to
2 be elected for not less than twelve consecutive months
3 prior to the next general election?"

4 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
5 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
6 underscored.

7 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
8 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
9 the State of Hawaii.
